

January 2023 - Scaffolding Brackets

INCIDENT ALERT & LESSON LEARNED

What Happened?

Employee Owner was moving scaffolding brackets from the top of a stack of EFCO forms into a plastic tote that is used to store brackets. The employee tossed a bracket into the tote, and it bounced off the top stack of the brackets and contacted the Employee Owner's left calf causing injury.

What Have We Learned? What Were Behaviors or Conditions Contributed? & Reminders:

- The tote was stored next to the EFCO forms which caused toss brackets down to tote and bracket hit EO in leg
- The plastic tote was filled with more scaffolding brackets than were safe
- Group doesn't have enough plastic tote cages for all scaffolding brackets, easy to obtain from Asphalt Branch
- EO tossed scaffolding bracket into tote and bounced out causing an unsafe act, which resulted in injury to calf
- Huddle & assess manual material handling and awkward positions/situations may cause problems.
- Brackets should be neatly stacked in the totes when transported/storing. Approximately 36 brackets per tote

Facts – Leading Causes of Work-Related Deaths Are Contact with Objects. This Could Include:

- Struck against an object
- Struck by an object
- · Caught in an object or equipment
- · Caught in collapsing material
